



His machine for thinking



Myth is the way in which human societies give structure and meaning to experience.


> But the larger mythic structures of history we've been deploying for the last several centuries simply don't work any more.

> > They are impossible to reconcile with the evidence now before our eyes, and the structures and meanings they encourage are tawdry, shop-worn and politically disastrous.



The Dominant Myth

The clockwork world of Newton, Descartes, and Bacon

Mechanistic

Predictable

Controllable



Reductionist

Understandable

We are separate from Nature.


Nature can be exploited





An Eco-system of Myths

This gives the eco-system a robustness and stability which is hard to change.



Other Myths which thrive in this ecosystem

Veneer Theory

Humanity is mean, selfish and brutal and needs to be controlled by civilisation to create a veneer of decency.

Monocausotaxophilia

The love of a single idea which explains everything

Clearly this ecosystem of myths is extremely destructive.

It is predominantly European, patriarchal, authoritarian and Christian.

There are many alternatives which have demonstrated their ability to co-exist with nature for millennia.

The Challenge!

How to begin to disrupt the current Ecosystem of Myths and help it to evolve into another which would encourage participatory democracy, regenerative economics and agriculture, and distribute resources fairly?


Possible Approaches

Stories grounded in the new EoM could prove to be invasive species which disrupt the existing Myths.


Identify and disseminate new Key-stone Myths
