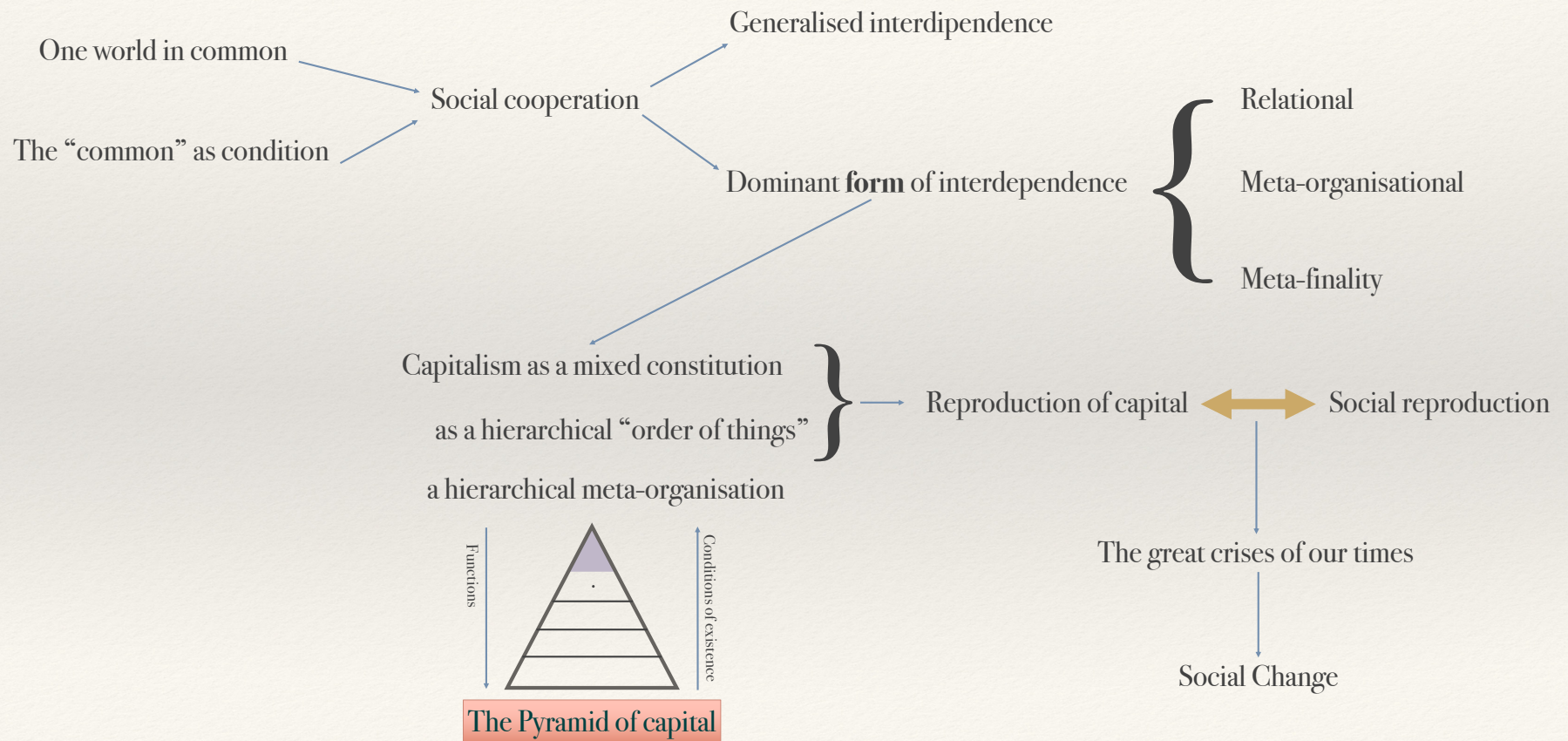

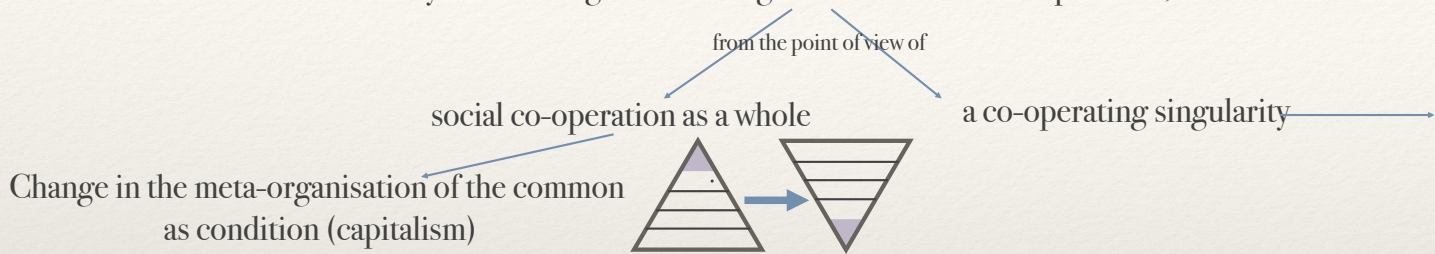


# The common as condition



# Social Change

By social change as the reorganisation of social cooperation, i.e. the common as a condition.



social change is ultimately based on the reorganisation of social relations, which Felix Guattari expresses as the reorganisation of the existing relationship between subjectivity and its exteriority, i.e. the systems that interact with subjectivity as its context. (Guattari 2000: 27)

Social change = moving towards another selection of fundamental components and relations, another identity

(Meta)organisation (Maturama and Varela) is a selection of fundamental components and relations reproduced through a process of autopoiesis.

enable distinct and interconnected processes that reproduce that system in its identity, i.e. in the pursuit of its meta-finalities.

the identity is both

Changeable → so many are the forms capitalism and its regulation taken in space and historical time

Fixed → the self-preservation of capital is identical to itself throughout history and is based on the drive to accumulation.

**Identity of autopoietic capitalism**

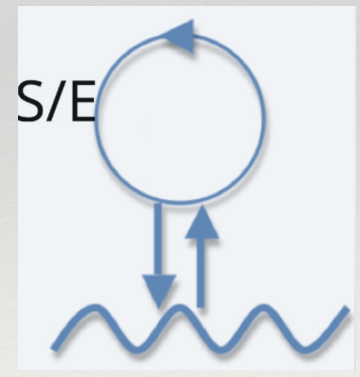
**Identity of autopoietic alter-organisation, or Social change**

evolves as result of change in structural components (subjects, things, ideas, cultures), and sympoietic processes defining relations

social reproduction in broad sense, "production of human beings", and since we are organic part of Gaia, "production of Gaia by means of Gaia" in the context of capitalism

The Organisation

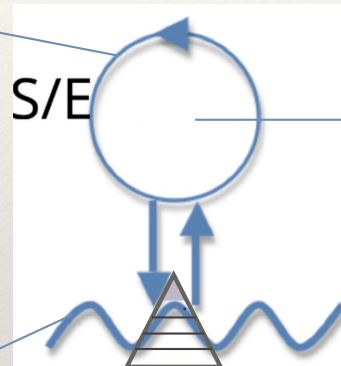
→ Seeking congruence between means and ends





# the Organisation

Meta-finality, purpose Social reproduction in the meta-context of capitalism ==> implies the transformation of social cooperation under capitalist hegemony (in different contexts), through struggle and the promotion of alternative forms of social cooperation through commons (struggle + commons = commons movement (De Angelis 2017), or society in movement (Zibechi))



How? => Stafford Beer

The organisation finds itself operating in specific different concrete contexts depending on its scale and geographical location

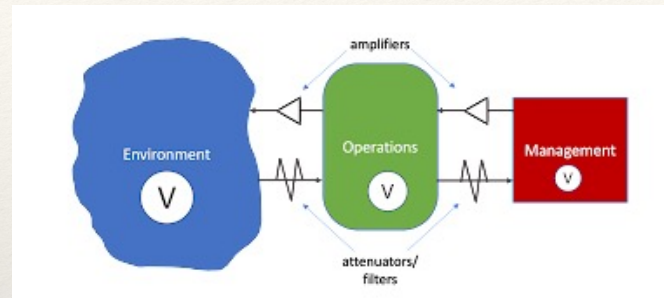
Context and meta-context

each of these contexts is also a particular expression of a meta-context, a meta-environment that has the pyramid of capital as its general description.

This meta-context reproduce deep crises of social reproduction, through the very dynamics and forms of regulation within the pyramid of capital => WHY? => Ashby law

# The why question

$$V(\text{environment}) > V(\text{operations}) > V(\text{management})$$



Hence regulator applies amplifiers and filters

The regulator will attempt to increase its variety in relation to that of the object of regulation through selective processes

include a filtering of both the variety of its environment and of the processes that will allow it to achieve this aim.

This will continue until the variety required to address the problem, and ensure the regulator's viability, is reached.

a very simple insight:

in order to deal with the diversity of the problems that the city (or any other entities) may face, a **repertoire of responses** with at least an equivalent level of nuance as those problems is essential.

In our cities, this **repertoire of responses is limited by the power structure and hegemony of statist and market-oriented responses. This limit variety of the (capital subordinated) regulator**

Solution?

Deeply democratise "regulation" across social cooperation in a city



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# The How Question

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How to balance?



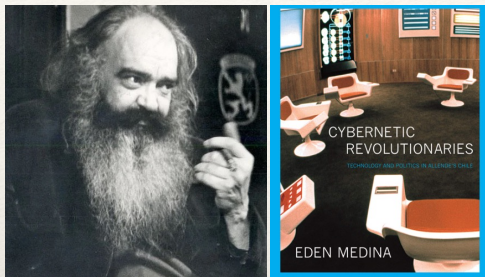
autonomy of the “parts”

one that strive to maintain a separate identity

# The How Question: The Viable System Model

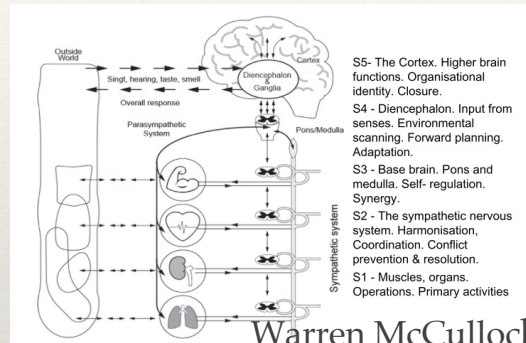


developed by organisational theorist and cyberneticist **Stafford Beer**.

A heterarchy is a system of organization where the elements of the organization are **unranked** (non-hierarchical) or where they possess the **potential to be ranked a number of different ways**.

In social and information sciences, heterarchies are networks of elements in which each element shares the **same "horizontal" position of power and authority**, each playing a theoretically equal role

The VSM suggests a **heterarchical model** in which organisations operate as cohesive neural networks, where each operational network ... is **autonomous self-organised, self-regulated, and self-referenced**, while the whole organisational network remains **cohesive** by sharing purposes, knowledge, and resources and relating to each other and to their niche in a harmonic way



conceptualises that system as **autopoietic** (capable of (re) producing itself)

composed of different levels of **autonomous self-governed subsystems**

VSM aims to design systems that **fully articulate the autonomy of its parts without compromising the cohesion of the whole, in relation to a common purpose (in our case social reproduction as the horizon of sense)**.

A system **capable of independent existence** organised in such a way as to be **adaptable and viable** and meet the demands of surviving in a changing environment (including capital reproduction)

The city (system) is **co-evolving with the social and ecological environment to which it relates to**.



# social change in an ideal world

**Problem** The hegemonic power structure of capital's order of things stifles the variety of choices and solutions possible according to private interests and established systemic power structures.

Solution is twofold

Change the hierarchical order of meta-finality



“Commonilise” social cooperation

attempt to **increase the variety of responses** to socio-ecological crises is achieved by increasing the variety available to the regulating subject.

by placing that of social reproduction above that of accumulation.

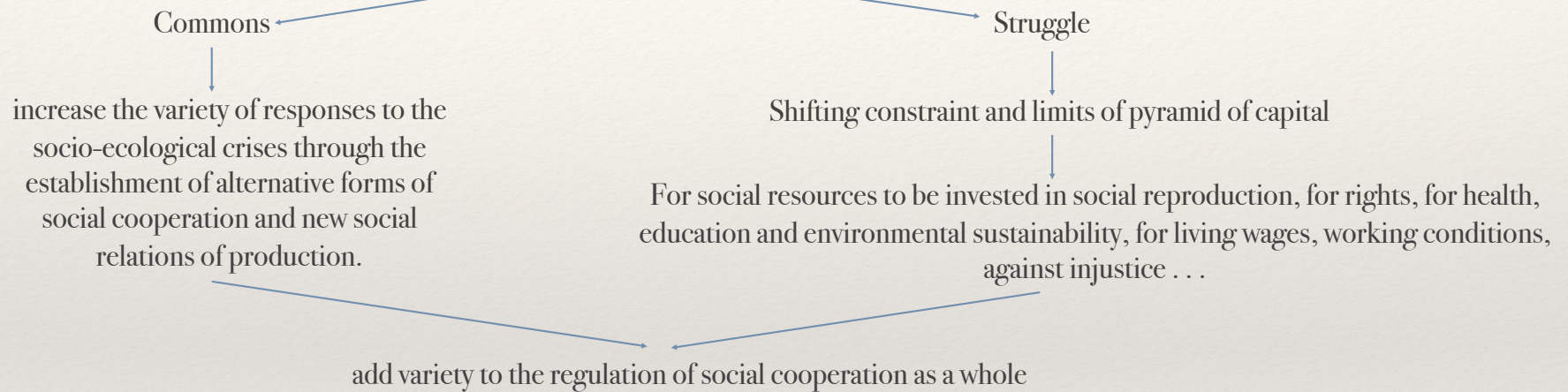
This implies the emergence of a transformative subjectivity, an Organisation, that puts its relationship with the environment in which it operates in new terms

variety gap narrows with the **increase of democracy** and the consequent **distribution of decision-making power over the resources and operations** of social cooperation

through much more **distributed, polycentric, more autonomous and participatory systems of governance**, spread throughout the territory, with a highly autonomous network of local actors pursuing specific forms and objectives of social reproduction within the different transversal spheres where it takes place: from factories to schools, from housing processes to health institutions....

# Social change in the messy world of power

The task of Organisation seeks to increase the variety of responses to the socio-ecological crises is along two axes

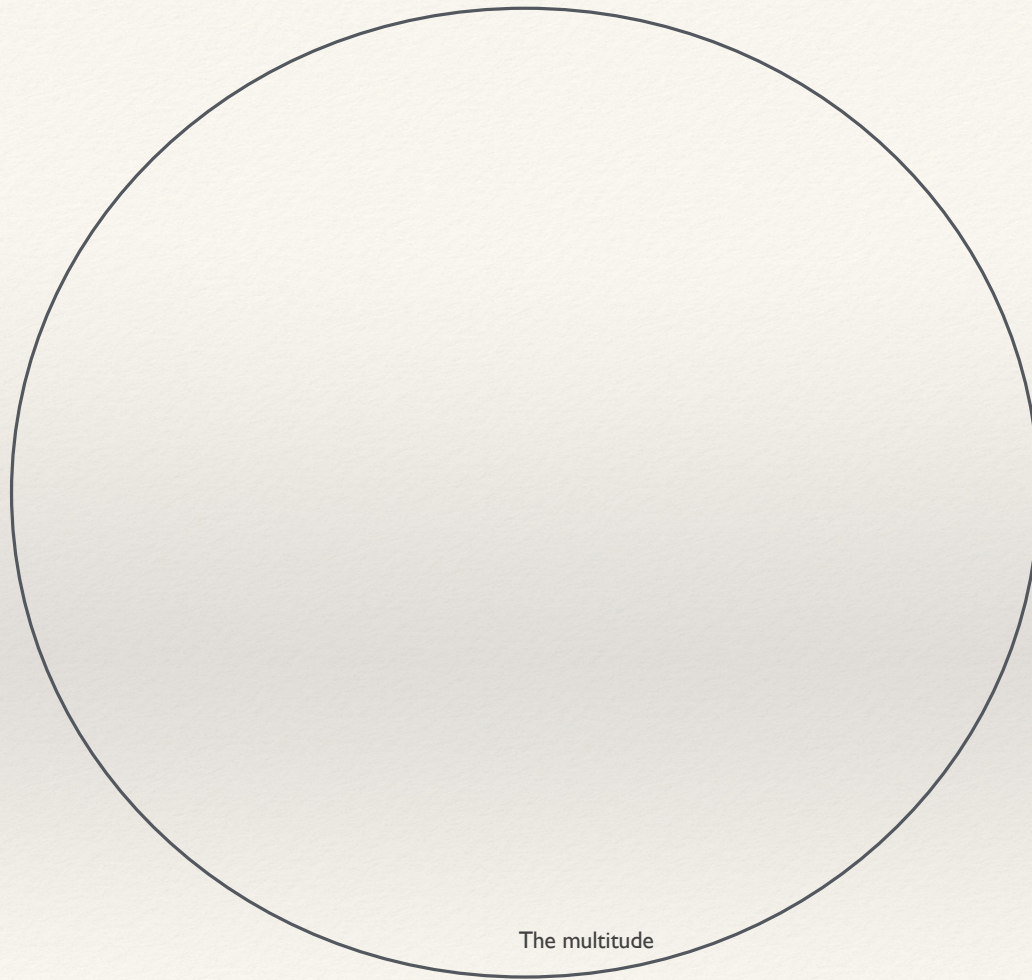


The organisation we are talking about is thus not entirely coincident with the one Stafford Beer had in mind.

unlike it, our Organisation not only aims to reproduce itself, but also to transform its context, i.e. the “order of things” in which it is embedded. Hence it is **also** a “political” Organization.

The multitude

The organised multitude

pursues a balance between a cohesion of the whole and an autonomy of the parts,  
Encompasses a systemic view of the entire operation  
encourages mutual support between operational units thus favouring the emergence of synergistic behaviours.  
It bridges the criteria for decision-making at the operational level with strategic criteria from higher organisational layers  
establishes a mechanism for resource bargaining and for critical appraisal of operations in System 1

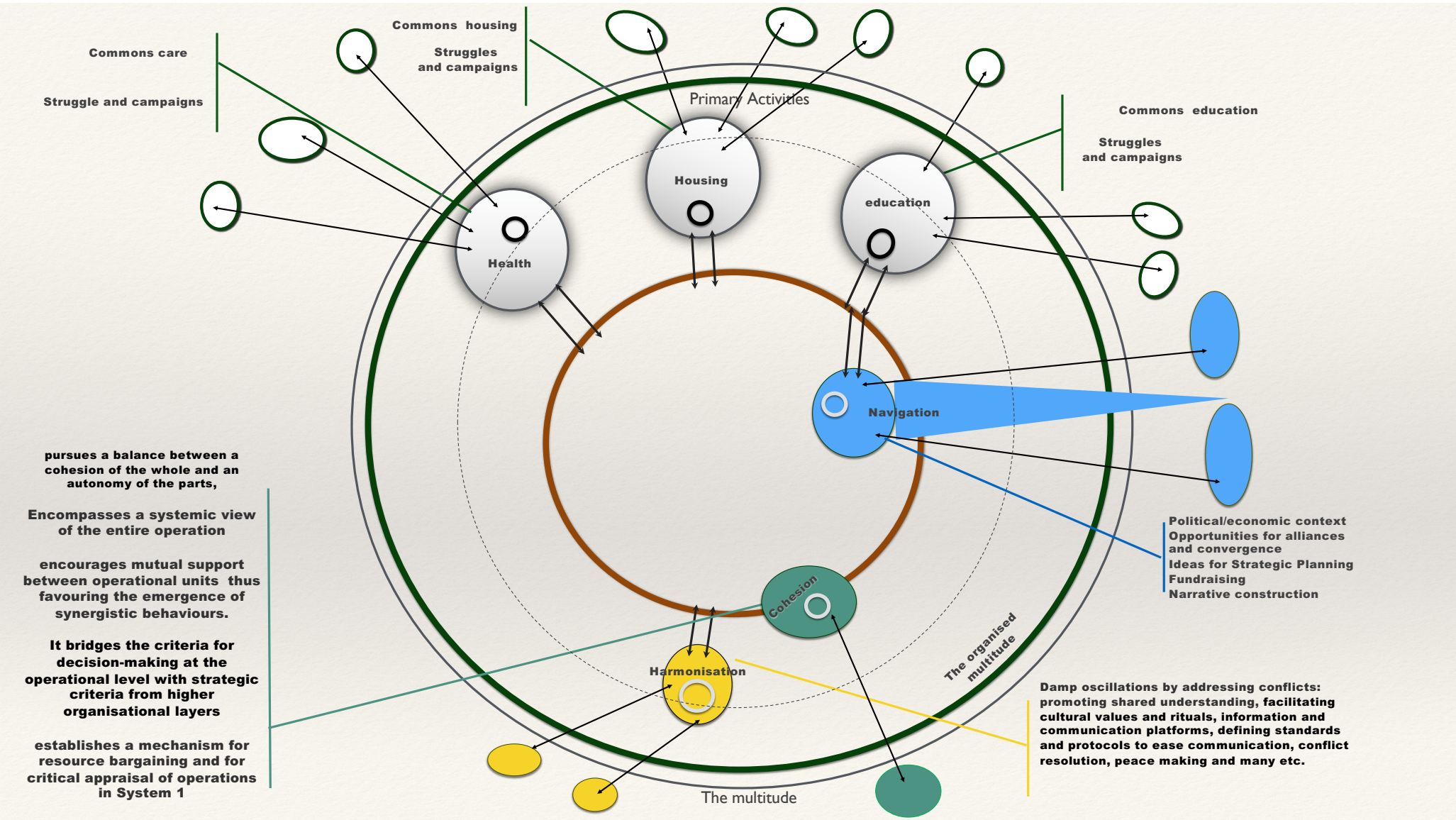

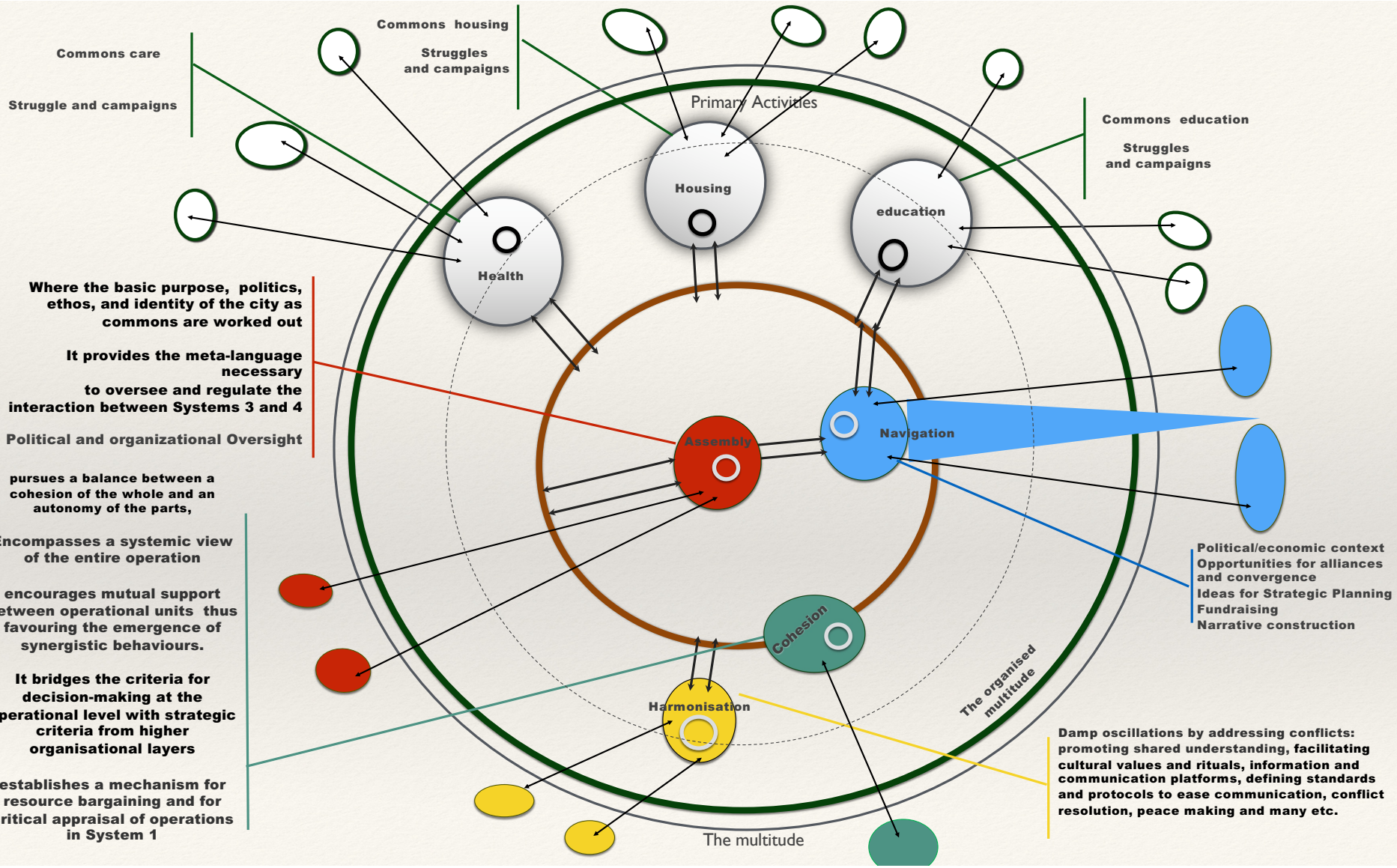

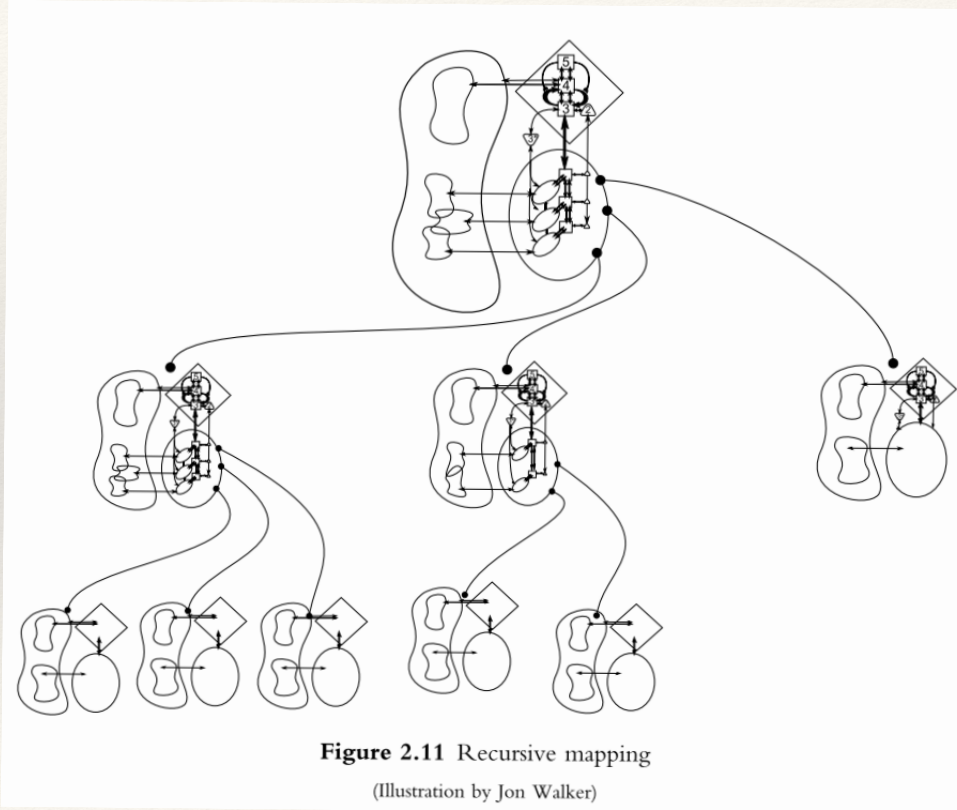
